Image Guidelines

It's worth thinking about images well in advance as copyright permission issues or insufficient quality may prevent images that are crucial to the article being published.

IMAGE SPECIFICATIONS

Images should be supplied electronically. Please don't embed images in the text, but supply as separate IMAGE files. The files should be renamed as the appropriate figure number referred to in the text.

Colour images will be displayed within the main text. Please specify where in the text the image goes by writing for example (figure 1), preferably at the end of a sentence, if this makes sense.

Images should be

- TIFF, JPEG, PDF format
- Images should be high quality, **at least 300dpi** (150lpi) resolution, **minimum width 80mm**. This is important as images that are smaller of lower resolution will not reproduce well in print even if they look fine on a screen.
- Line drawings should be supplied at **1200dpi**. Where they include colour, supply in CMYK colour space (spot colours will be converted to CMYK).

Please contact *The Picture Restorer* in advance of submitting your paper if you need help checking the resolution/ size/ colour of your images or if you are unsure of their suitability.

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Where possible, add copyright lines/acknowledgements to the figure captions before sending them to *The Picture Restorer*.

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
